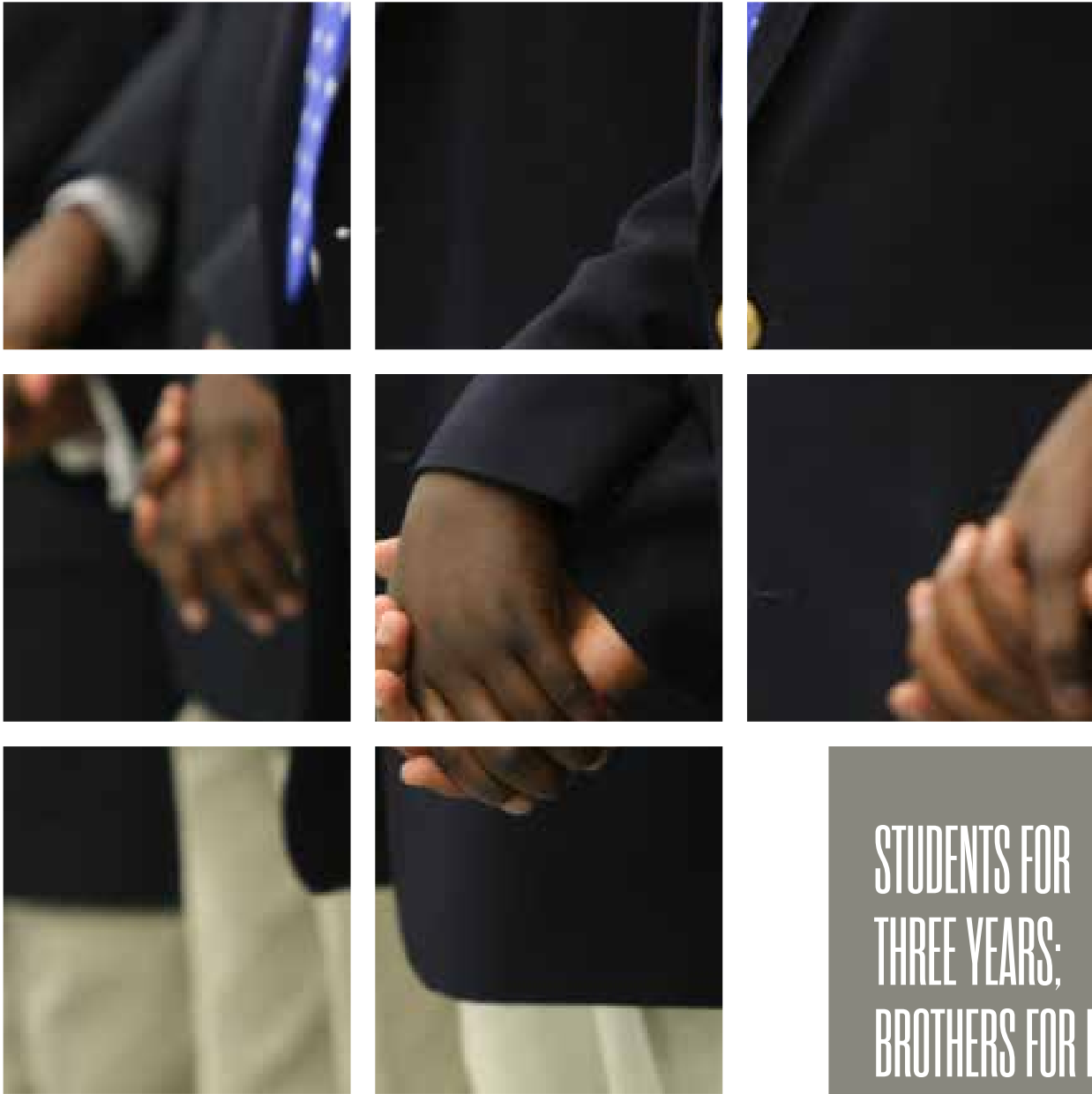

PERCENTILE GROWTH AT LOYOLA ACADEMY

Standardized tests measure students national percentile rankings by subject area. In looking at Loyola's graduating class of 2021, it is always interesting to see how scores change between a student's sixth grade year and his eighth grade year.

Comparative data from the Fall of 2018 (beginning of their sixth grade year) to the Spring of 2021 (end of their eighth grade year) yielded the results shown in the chart below. Our students began their Loyola Academy journey at or below the national average (50%).

However, by the end of their eighth grade year, students increased their scores significantly across most subject areas. This is especially meaningful when considering that our students learned from home for a large portion of their 7th and 8th grade years.

Dear Loyola Academy Family,

Thank you for all of your support as we navigated yet another unprecedented year. Your generosity made such a huge difference in the lives of our students. Here is an update on progress we made during the pandemic.

Students started the academic year with “School From Home”. Classes were facilitated via Zoom, and students had daily class meetings with independent work assignments. In November, Loyola transitioned to a cohort, hybrid model. Students attended classes in-person two days per week and learned from home the remainder of the week. In addition, while learning virtually, many students met on Zoom with a volunteer tutor to ensure comprehension of the material. The Loyola community navigated this school model with few quarantines and no known spread of the virus while at Loyola.

The changes necessitated by COVID-19 allowed us to fill a gap in knowledge that we were not aware existed prior to March 2020. Although our students used technology (phones and tablets) before COVID, they used the technology predominantly for entertainment and/or personal use.

Further, virtual learning increased our student’s skills in navigating the Office 365 Suite, writing effective emails,

navigating a digital notebook system, developing internet etiquette, and communicating with adults from a distance. These are critical skills that will lay a firm foundation for success in their future educational environments.

In the Jesuit tradition, Loyola Men continued to live lives of service during the 2021-2021 school year. The students identified cancer patients at Children’s Hospital as a demographic in need. They then collected donations and selected specific toys from the Children’s Hospital Wish List to purchase. The end result of this effort was that students were able to deliver just over \$400 worth of toys and games to pediatric oncology patients at Children’s Hospital.

We are most proud of our students and all they were able to accomplish over the past year. While some opportunities were limited and/or presented as closed doors altogether, new developments emerged to allow students to continue on their journey to success. Thank you for being a partner in that work.

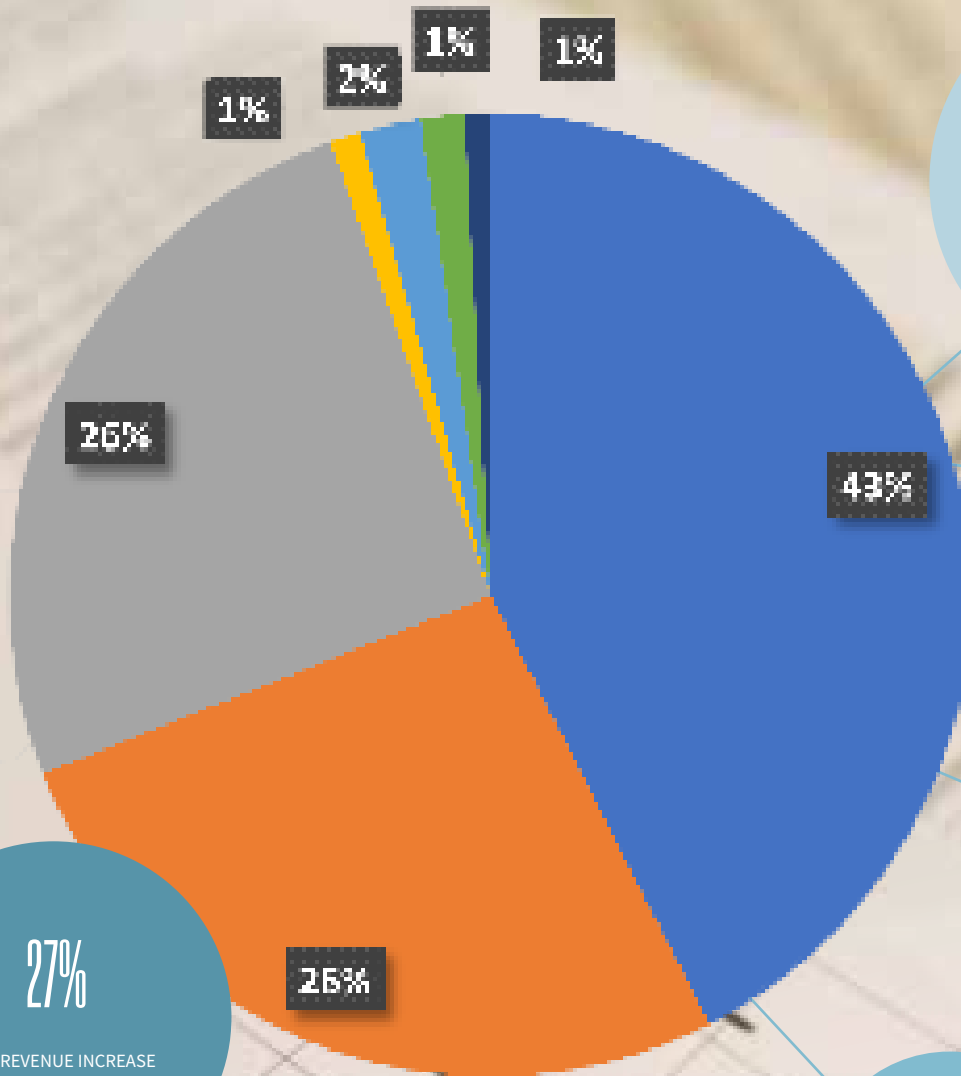

Loyola Academy of St. Louis is, in total, an 11+ year program as each graduate is supported through three years of middle school, four years of high school and up to four years of college, trade school or career prep. Each student receives the critical support needed to successfully transition from middle school to high school and from high school to college/career. Loyola Academy's Graduate Support Team visits each high school on a monthly basis checking in with our alums making sure they stay on track for academic success.

Through Loyola's Graduate Support program, alumni are supported (socially, academically and financially) throughout all four years of high

school and beyond. One hundred percent of Loyola graduates are accepted into local college preparatory high schools.

Alumni are also able to return regularly to Loyola's campus for tutoring, to utilize technology and simply to have a safe place to study and visit with other graduates. Alumni are expected to complete volunteer service hours at Loyola to give back to the school for the support they receive throughout their high school careers.

Alumni who receive high school tuition support are required to:

- **Maintain a minimum GPA of 2.5.**

- **Perform 2 hours of community service per quarter at Loyola Academy.**
- **Maintain a copy of most recent report card with Loyola's Office of Graduate Support.**
- **Remain in good standing both academically and behaviorally at the high school attended.**

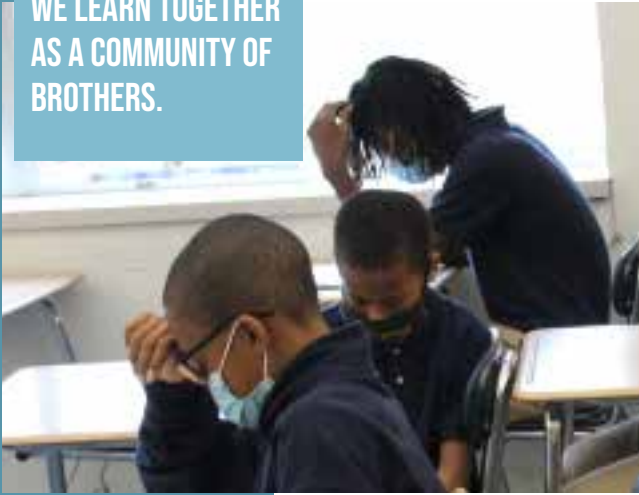

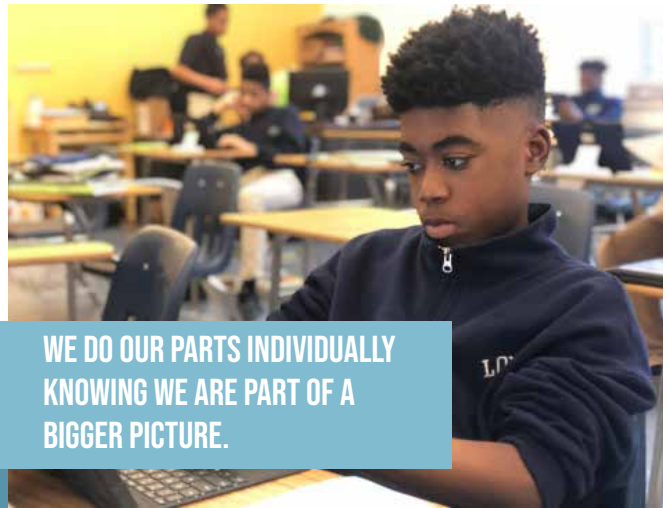
Reflections from Athletic Director, Gene Brion
